On October 6, 2009, over 500 gathered to celebrate the 4th Annual Valley Preferred Spirit of Courage Award Celebration in a football field size tent against the backdrop of Lehigh Valley Health Network's Muhlenberg campus. A fittingly large American flag suspended by dual aerial fire trucks swayed proudly overhead while local heroes who performed selfless acts to save another from a burn or death by fire were applauded. Nine otherwise ordinary individuals received awards for saving another individual from home or vehicular fires. "I didn't know what to expect when I agreed to attend this event, but I can honestly tell you now that I am overwhelmed and nearly speechless. I assure you that the Professional Firefighters Association will hear about this event and will want to become actively engaged", said David Schmidt, Secretary/Treasurer of the PA Professional Firefighter Association.

Partners in Prevention awards were also presented to individuals or groups who share The Burn Prevention Foundation's mission and have done an outstanding job promoting fire safety or burn prevention education. Awardees included Jaqueline Umberger of the Chambersburg Fire Department, The Saucon Valley Fire Safety Coalition and Ralph Slider, retired Deputy Chief of the Allentown Fire Department.

The ceremony concluded with the presentation of the Phoenix Award to John Capanna, a burn survivor, who sustained burns over 90% of his body from an oil refinery explosion when he was just 20. John held the audience spellbound by his tale of pain, rejection and recovery. John is actively engaged in burn survivor support and peer counseling programs and speaks candidly about his experience.

Gregory Kile, Executive Director and CEO of presenting sponsor Valley Preferred, in response to the event said, "Congratulations to everyone who made this event a success. Once again, a HOME RUN!" A primary mission of Valley Preferred is to promote health and wellness throughout the community. The proceeds of this event support regional burn prevention education and burn survivor support activities.

2009 School Programs

During the month of October, 2009, every public and private school with children in grade 2-8 once again received our two school programs, "Stop, Drop, Roll, Cool, & Call" (grades 2-5) and "The Great Escape" (grades 6-8). **Stop, Drop, Roll, Cool, & Call** focuses on teaching children what to do if their clothing should catch on fire, as well as appropriate first aid for burns and how to call for help. It includes posters/lesson plan, bookmarks, and a DVD featuring former Philadelphia Eagle all-pro safety, Brian Dawkins. **The Great Escape** teaches children the importance of planning and practicing an escape plan from their home, and includes activity sheets, lesson plan, and a DVD.

With the addition of two new counties to our service area this year (Cumberland and Dauphin), we were able to reach a much larger number of students with these programs than ever before. **Stop, Drop, Roll, Cool, & Call** was mailed to 673 schools, with a total of 152,600 students in grades 2-5. **The Great Escape** was mailed to 525 schools, with over 121,200 students in grades 6-8. Together we have the potential of reaching almost 274,000 students and their families with this life saving information!
